The company is partnering with Rona and the Better Business Bureau of Mainland B.C. for the event, which is intended to help prevent fraud and identity theft.

"March is National Fraud Prevention Month in Canada, and all three organizations are committed to helping raise awareness of the growing problem of identity theft and other forms of fraudulent activities" said Silver Bullet's founder and president, Bailey Jung.

People are encouraged to bring their old tax returns, bank statements and other personal documents to the parking lot of the Rona store located at 2727 East 12th Ave. to have them destroyed.

"It was a natural fit for us to come together and put this event on for the community," said John Gatti, Rona store manager.

Shredding is being offered free of charge, but donations will be accepted with all proceeds going to support the Greater Vancouver Food Bank.

The event takes place from noon to 3 p.m.
