Shredding for a good cause

Two Burnaby-based businesses are teaming up this Saturday to help a Burnaby organization in need.

Silver Bullet Shredding is a document destruction provider that prefers to support local causes and smaller charities that don't get a lot of attention or exposure.

The company hosts several free community shred events throughout the year to support local causes. Often, the company will bring in a larger corporate partner, one with a higher profile to lend support for the cause. Such is the case when Silver Bullet Shredding and Rona will co-host a free community shredding event for the residents of Burnaby this Saturday June 20 9:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. at Rona Burnaby at 7260 Edmonds Street to raise needed funds for the Pacific Assistance Dogs Society (PADS).

PADS breeds, raises, and trains assistance dogs for persons with a physical disability or who are deaf or hard of hearing. The organization receives virtually no government funding and functions with minimal professional staff to train the dogs and administer its programs.

Silver Bullet Shredding is providing the shredding truck and personnel, while Rona is providing the venue and support staff. PADS is also contributing by ensuring their volunteers are out at the event with their dogs to meet and greet guests.

"The event is a team effort. It is a great way for us to connect with the local community, support a local charity, and bring people together for a good cause," said Silver Bullet Shredding founder/president Bailey Jung.
